This the question is: What is a miracle?

<u>Acts 2:22</u>

22 "Men of Israel, hear these words: Jesus of Nazareth, a Man attested by God to you **by miracles**, wonders, and signs which God did through Him in your midst, as you yourselves also know.

Notice the word "miracles" in this passage. Jesus performed miracles. Our question is, "What is a miracle?"

<u>William Lane Craig defined a miracle as</u>: "an event which is not producible by the natural causes that are operative at the time and place that the event occurs." (via <u>The Case For Faith</u>, Lee Strobel, p. 84).

This is a very helpful definition. Consider the following example:

<u>Acts 3:1-9</u>

1 Now Peter and John went up together to the temple at the hour of prayer, the ninth hour.

2 And a certain man lame from his mother's womb was carried, whom they laid daily at the gate of the temple which is called Beautiful, to ask alms from those who entered the temple;

3 who, seeing Peter and John about to go into the temple, asked for alms.

- 4 And fixing his eyes on him, with John, Peter said, "Look at us."
- 5 So he gave them his attention, expecting to receive something from them.

6 Then Peter said, "Silver and gold I do not have, but what I do have I give you: In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, rise up and walk."

7 And he took him by the right hand and lifted him up, and immediately his feet and ankle bones received strength.

8 So he, leaping up, stood and walked and entered the temple with them — walking, leaping, and praising God.

9 And all the people saw him walking and praising God.

Suppose that one day doctors and scientists are able to cure lame people by using special equipment, medicines, and laser treatments. And suppose further that they were able to apply their knowledge in such a way so that a lame man would stand up immediately and begin to walk. If this were to actually happen, it would not be a miracle. It would simply have been the application of modern medicine.

However, in the days of Jesus and His apostles, such medical technologies did not exist. The lame man walking was a true Bible miracle because the lame man began to walk immediately without any modern technologies of any kind. Only the divine power of God could have accomplished this feat. This was a miracle.

According to the scriptures, we know the following about miracles:

- **Miracles were only temporary**. They were designed for the purpose of confirming the truthfulness of new, divine revelation according to Mk 16:20.
- Miracles were not intended to make life more pleasant. Although a healing would make someone more comfortable, that was not it's purpose. The purpose of miracles, as we just stated, was to confirm new, divine revelation (Heb 2:2).
- Miracles would end when all new, divine revelation was revealed. In other words, when all the NT scriptures were finished, miracles would cease (1 Cor 13:8-13; Eph 4:7-16).

<u>In conclusion</u>: There are no more miracles occurring today like Jesus and His apostles performed. When people today claim to work miracles, you are faced with a choice: Do you believe the scriptures or do you believe the one telling you about their miracle? It's that simple. As for me, I choose to believe the scriptures.

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
